Course Description

An introduction to using Adobe Photoshop for creating digital images. Through hands-on applications, students will explore the use of layers and essential software tools and controls for creating composite images from multiple image sources. Each week I will post video lectures that will demonstrate how to complete the following assignments. There will be 4 exercises and 2 short quizzes to prepare you for the 3 projects in the second half of the course. Desire 2 Learn (D2L) is where all lectures will be posted and where all projects will be submitted.

Course Learning Objectives

Upon completion of the course you will learn the tools and techniques in Adobe Photoshop to effectively cut and paste images. You will also learn how to input correct perspective, colour adjustments, layers, image masking and special effects.

Grading Criteria

Grades for artwork will be posted online approximately one week after the due date. All assignments will **lose 3%** for every day they are late. Projects will be submitted with a rubric specific to the assignment. The final day to submit any assignment is **Mon. April 17, 2023**. Any assignments submitted after that date will not be marked.

Exercises 32% (8% each)

Exercise 1: Cut and paste person into scene (supplied images). Rubric: Organization 20%, quality 40%, use of technique 40%.

Exercise2: Input supplied images into correct perspective. Rubric: Organization 20%, quality 40%, use of technique 40%.

Exercise 3: Image correction, from a supplied image you will be given a list of corrections to make such as removing elements, creating adjustments, colour correction and adding effects. **Rubric:** Organization 20%, quality 40%, use of technique 40%.

Exercise 4: Image retouching of a supplied image with a variety of tools and adjustments. **Rubric:** Organization 20%, quality 40%, use of technique 40%.

Quizzes 10% (5% each)

<u>Quiz 1:</u> A combination of true/false and multiple choice **<u>Quiz 2</u>**: A combination of true/false and multiple choice

Projects 58%- Each project accompanied by a lecture and description on D2L. Project 1: Build a room, you will be supplied a background image and create a living space with your choice of theme. You must use techniques taught in the lectures. (17%)

Rubric: Organization 15%, quality 35%, use of techniques 35%, creativity/cohesion 15%.

Project 2: Creative Challenge, you must supply your own images to create an outdoor scene with a minimum of 7 objects added using numerous techniques. You must include at least one person and one animal. Dimensions will be 12 in. w x 10 in. h at 300ppi. **(17%)**

Rubric: Organization 15%, quality 35%, use of techniques 35%, creativity/cohesion 15%.

<u>Project 3 (FINAL)</u>: Street Scene, you will be supplied an image of a street surrounded by buildings. You will have to add a minimum of 10 images into the scene using the techniques taught throughout the semester. (24%) Rubric: Organization 15%, quality 35%, use of techniques 35%, creativity/cohesion 15%.

Description of Grading Rubrics for Exercises and Projects

Organization: Proper arrangement of layers and groups, colour coding and labelling to improve functionality of the artwork/document.

Quality: Assessing quality in artwork includes the overall use and mastering of the materials, the attention given to achieving craftsmanship and the application of guiding concepts.

Use of Technique: Effective use of and exploration of techniques, processes and tools.

Creativity/Cohesion: Originality, quality of design and complexity of concepts.

LU Department of Visual Arts Grading Guidelines

- A+ 90-100% Superior achievement, reserved for work of exceptional quality. Student shows maturity, selfdiscipline, and independent thought.
- A 80-89% Notable achievement. Work demonstrates command of media, conceptual maturity, and a commitment to the discipline beyond what is normally expected.
- B 70-79% Work is completed and above average in quality. Student shows understanding and creativity in technical and conceptual areas.
- C 60-69% Student completes all assignments and meets all requirements of assignments. Work shows average ability and understanding of creative and technical values
- D 50-59% Minimum passing grade. Quantity and/or quality of work are minimal. Work shows poor ability and/or lack of discipline.

Just be aware that Photoshop Elements is NOT the same program, and you will not be able to complete the course with that software. To prepare for the course please download Photoshop onto your computer, here are a few options to do so.

Backing Up Your Work

Photoshop files can often be very large and require a lot of memory space. With that being said, I recommend that you backup your computer regularly and also keep a USB copy of your files. Saving your work on Creative Cloud,

Google Drive, Dropbox, or iCloud are also great options. This keeps your computer and programs working smoothly as often, large files can cause lagging and slow loading.

NOTE: Never work on your files directly on the USB drive, save them on the USB drive as a second copy. Large Photoshop files can easily cause problems on a USB drive, so take this precaution to avoid any missed assignments due to technical issues.
