**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

**Course Overview:** A study of management's use of accounting information to make decisions related to planning, controlling, and evaluating the organization's operations. The behavior and management of costs, as well as techniques used to evaluate and control results of operations are discussed. Topics include: cost terminology, cost behavior, cost- volume-profit analysis, job order costing, activity based costing, segment reporting, budgeting, standards, performance measures and variance analysis, evaluation of decentralized operations, and differential analysis techniques. This course is presented from the perspective of the *user* of accounting information rather than the *preparer* of such information.

Analytical problems solving techniques, including data analytics and the use of spreadsheets will be utilized as decision- making tools.
